Every employee of the Institute shall be governed by the Code of Conduct, as specified herein and every employee, without exception shall be liable to strict disciplinary action, including suspension and or termination, for the breach of any provision(s) of the code of conduct. The Principal shall initiate disciplinary proceedings for non-compliance of any employee related to the code of conduct/service rules/leave rules or any other rules of the Institute that may be in force from time to time and shall have the power to appoint an enquiry officer(s) to conduct an inquiry into the charges against such an employee.</p> <p>General Guidelines</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Every employee shall at all times maintain absolute integrity and devotion to duty, and also be strictly honest and impartial in his / her official dealings. 2. An employee should at all times be courteous in his / her dealings with other members of the staff, students and members of the public. 3. An employee shall be required to observe the schedule hours of work, as may be notified from time to time, during which he/she must be present at the place of his/her duty. Unless and otherwise stated, all employees of the Institute are required to work effectively for at least 42 hours per week. 4. Except for valid reasons and/or unforeseen contingencies no employee shall absent himself/herself from duty without prior permission of the designated authority. 5. No employee shall leave station except with the prior permission of the designated authority. 6. All employees are expected to be exemplary in their public as well as private life. Provided that no such sanction shall be required if such broadcast or such contribution is as a purely literary, artistic or scientific character. <p>Criticism of the Institute</p> <p>Criticism of any kind in radio broadcast or in any document published unanimously or in his/her own name or in the name of any other person or in any communication to the press or in any public utterance, will be viewed seriously.</p>
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Unauthorized Communication of Information

- a. No employee shall, except in accordance with any general or special order of the Principal or in the performance in good faith of the duties assigned to him/her, communicate, directly or indirectly, any official document or information to any person to whom he/she is not authorized to communicate such document or information.
- b. During the term of his/her employment with the Institute , or at anytime thereafter, an employee shall not use or disclose to any other society, firm, organization or person any information concerning the secrets, activities or affairs of the Institute, or countenance any act prejudicial to the interest of the Institute.

Private Trade Employment

- a. No employee shall engage directly or indirectly, in any trade or business or any private tuition or undertake any employment outside his official assignments.
- b. Provided that the above restrictions shall not apply to academic work and consultative practice undertaken with the prior permission of the Principal which may be given subject, to as regards acceptance of remuneration, as may be laid down by the“GB”.

Insolvency, Habitual Indebtness and Criminal Proceedings

- a. An employee shall so manage his/her private affairs as to avoid habitual indebtedness or insolvency. When an employee is found liable to arrest for debt or has recourse to insolvency or when it is found that a moiety of his/her salary is continuously being attached, he/she may be liable to dismissal. An employee who becomes the subject of legal proceedings for insolvency shall forthwith report full facts to the Institute.
- b. An employee who gets involved in some criminal proceedings shall immediately inform the Principal through the Head of Department to which he/she is attached, irrespective of the fact whether he/she has been released on bail or not
- c. An employee who is detained in police custody whether on criminal or otherwise for a period longer than 8 hours shall not join his/her duties at the Institute unless he/she has obtained written permission to that effect from the GB of the Institute .

Vindication of Acts and Character of Employees

No employee shall, except with the previous sanction of the Principal, have recourse to any court of law or to the press for the vindication of any official act which has been the subject matter of adverse criticism or an attack of defamatory character.

Representation

Whenever an employee wishes to put forth any claim, or seeks redress of any grievance or of any wrong done to him/her, he/she must forward his/her case through proper channel to Grievance & Redressal cell.

Jurisdiction

Dispute(s) if any, arising out of these Service Rules or any other rules

that may be force from time to time will be resolved at the appropriate institutional board.

Identification

- a. It shall be mandatory for every employee of the Institute to carry on his/her person, at all times, when at the Institute and produce the same on demand, an identity card or any other mark of identification, as may be prescribed by the “GB” from time to time.
- b. An employee shall on resigning and/or termination from the services of the Institute, immediately hand over such identity card and/or mark of identification to the Principal of the Institute or any other official designated for the purpose.
- c. The use of such identity card and/or mark of identification shall be governed by the terms and conditions of the Institute from time to time.

Disciplinary Action / Suspension

The Principal may place a member of the staff appointed at the Institute under suspension:

- a. Where a disciplinary proceeding against him is contemplated or is pending or;
- b. Where a case against him in respect of any criminal offence is under investigation or trial.
- c. An employee against whom disciplinary action is proposed or likely to be taken shall be given a charge sheet clearly setting forth the circumstances appearing against him/her, and a date shall be fixed for the inquiry.
- d. Sufficient time of not less than one week shall be given to him/her to prepare and given his/her explanation, as also to produce any evidence that he/she may wish to tender in his/her defense. He/she shall be permitted to appear before the officer conducting the inquiry, to cross-examine any witness on whose evidence the charge rests. The employee will be permitted to produce evidence/witness in his/her defense.
- e. At the conclusion of inquiry, the inquiry officer who shall be appointed by the Principal.
- f. The Principal shall consider the findings of the inquiry and propose to the Chairman “GB” to impose a major penalty, a minor penalty or no-penalty at all. The action taken by the Principal shall necessarily need to be ratified by the Chairman “GB”.

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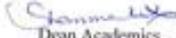

- Internal question paper and Assignment Questions are prepared based on Bloom's taxonomy and Bloom's score will be calculated to identify the level of difficulty in the questions.

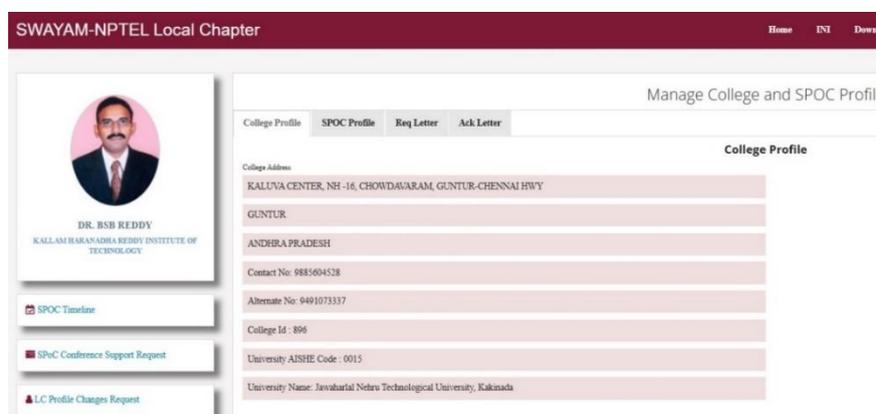
Blended learning – MOOCs by SWAYAM

SWAYAM is a program initiated by Govt. of India and designed to achieve the three cardinal principles of Education Policy viz., access, equity and quality. SWAYAM hosts online courses which are interactive and prepared by the best teachers in the country.

Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) is essentially an asynchronous platform and a process for teaching through pre-recorded lectures, resource video materials, lecture notes, assignments and quizzes, which are usually online and provide self-assessment in regular intervals during learning. These courses are open for anyone to access – at no cost.

The students and faculty who are interested in learning gets access to quality content, which also includes discussion with the content creator and access to assignments for self-testing. MOOCs through NPTEL-SWAYAM are self-paced in nature and promote self-learning which instills Lifelong learning skills amongst the learners.

In KHIT we are conducting MOOCs courses in the blended learning environment for encouraging students to earn and transfer credits through NPTEL courses and to imbibe life-long learning skills. Our students and faculty access all the courses available on Swayam platform through KHIT –SWAYAM NPTEL local chapter.

The blended MOOCs is a form of flipped classroom using in-person class meetings (synchronous learning) to supplement a massive open online courses (Asynchronous learning). Students access blended MOOCs, blends synchronous and asynchronous learning- outside of class and then come to a class meeting for discussions or in-class activities.

COLLABORATIVE LEARNING:

The institute is promoting collaborative learning by implementing peer to

Peer to Peer (P-P) Teaching: Peer to peer teaching is an effective teaching technique that can be used in the classroom/ lab to enhance learning. It takes the fear out of class room discussion by allowing the students to think and share carefully with a partner/peer before they called to respond.</p> <p>Implementation of Think-Pair-Share Methodology: Monitor and support students as they work through the following: T: (Think) Teachers initiate the process by asking a specific question. Students "think" about what they know or have learned about the topic. P: (Pair) Each student shall be paired with another student or a small group. S: (Share) Students share their thinking with their partner. Teachers expand the "share" into a whole-class discussion. The following are few more collaborative learning activities that are implemented by Electrical & Electronics Engineering Department. They are as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Seminars • Poster presentations • Paper presentations • Group Discussion • Lecture with Quiz • JAM sessions <p>Impact Analysis: It is observed that, the students are actively involved in co-curricular activities conducted by different organizations. 4. Swatcha Bharath Campaigns

Swachh Bharat Abhiyan is also known as the Clean India Mission. The Indian Government has introduced this campaign to cover all the backward statutory towns and to make them clean. This national level campaign includes the construction of latrines, awareness about sanitation in the rural areas, cleaning streets, roads and changing the infrastructure of the country to lead and develop the country ahead. The college NSS team has actively participated in the Swatch Bharath campaign and has taken the initiation to clean the Dasarapalem village. Girl students along with the faculty members cleaned the streets of village and the boy students participated in the decomposition of the waste.



5. Energy Conservation:

In order to cater the needs of our growing energy needs, it is very important to preserve the energy resources. It has been taught to the students to use the electricity legibly, so that they can conserve energy everywhere in this way. The classroom power consumption is monitored by the class teacher and the class representative. In the laboratories also, the equipment is serviced immediately at the closing of semester, to reduce the excessive power utilization. Initiative has been taken up to use state-of-the art technology to monitor water levels of the tanks, so that

there is a possibility of preserving water. Hoardings displaying the urgent need to preserve the natural resources have been set up on the campus to alert and alarm the future generations regarding the importance of non-renewable energy sources.

Use of renewable energy:

Non-conventional energy resource –‘solar energy’ setup in the campus is under the discussion among the management members. The management has the idea to set up the solar power plant in a phased manner as the alternative energy resource.

Solar Energy: As a green campus initiative to conserve the electric power in the campus, the institute has commissioned 155KWp roof top solar PV plant. Approximately 18000 units are generated per month and estimated total power consumption in the college is on average 14000 units/month.



6. Plantation:

The college is situated in 10 plus acres of land and there is abundant greenery on the campus in the form of Avenue Plantation. Different varieties of trees and lawns are maintained on the campus which gives pleasant environment of the institution. The student volunteers have actively participated in the sapling plantation and mass plantation programs as a part of NSS program. This has stopped the soil erosion also on the campus. Saplings of Jatropha, Neem, Tamarind, etc were planted in the college and hostel. The college has taken the responsibility of extending this program to the nearby localities. There is regular watering to the plants daily by the supporting staff.
